Jay A. Fishman, M.D. is Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, Director of the Transplant Infectious Diseases and Compromised Host Program at the Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH), and Associate Director of the MGH Transplant Center. Dr. Fishman attended the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, completed Internal Medicine and Infectious Disease training at MGH, and Fellowships in Molecular Biology and Genetics at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Fishman established the Transplant and Immunocompromised Host Program which has trained many leaders in this field worldwide. His experience in infectious diseases of solid organ and stem cell transplant recipients, and background in immunology, virology and molecular biology provide the basis of studies of infectious risk in xenotransplantation, notably of the roles of viruses, including porcine endogenous retrovirus and cytomegalovirus, in preclinical models of xenotransplantation. He has over 300 peer-reviewed publications and a frequent contributor at international symposia. He is Past-President of the American Society of Transplantation. He is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, the American Society of Transplantation, and the Infectious Disease Society of America. He has received career achievement awards from AST and TTS.
